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## INTRODUCTION Professor Cyrus Kerawala, 61st BAOMS President

In addition to the Welcome Reception on Wednesday, the annual black-tie event will take place the following evening in the splendour of the Great Hall at Lincoln's Inn Fields, preceded by drinks on the terrace outside.

The meeting I hope will be a step away from the usual format, one that will be supported by a dedicated conference App which will be available for all registered attendees. I very much hope you will make the trip to London and look forward to seeing you there.


