INTRODUCTION DALJIT K DHARIWAL 62ND PRESIDENT

It is a great honour to have been elected President of the British Association of Oral & Maxillofacial Surgeons. I started professional life as a dental surgery assistant in Southall, West London, and decided to go on to study dentistry in Cardiff, where I was enthused by Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery. It was daunting to go back to medical school with the prospect of taking on debt to pursue my chosen career field. I was fortunate to be supported by the local OMFS units where I continued my specialty training followed by a craniofacial fellowship in Birmingham which was the icing on the cake of training. This led me to my current post in Oxford where I have been a consultant for 17 years. I genuinely feel I have the best job in the world. I am fortunate to have an interesting clinical practice, to coordinate surgical teaching at the medical school at Oxford University, and to have the support of my colleagues to balance my work life with being a single mum.

As a specialty we have always faced greater challenges than other surgical specialties. It is important at this time of political change that we do not lose sight of the sacrifices we made for our own careers and to ensure that we provide support and mentoring for the OMFS surgeons of the future. Our doctors and dentists in training face greater financial challenges than we did in the past and they have not benefited from the support network provided by firm working. We work in a fantastic

rewarding specialty and in close collaboration with other surgeons to deliver high quality patient care. It is important that we recognise the differing landscape and take new talent under our wings to develop new colleagues who will be far better than us.

As a leader, I promised you greater transparency and accountability, and I have been fortunate to work with BAOMS' elected Council who have stepped up to serve the members in the same vein. Last year we agreed a mission statement on Council pledging to improve patient care and eliminate poor practice; to ensure a supportive, inclusive and safe culture, and to provide educational support for all members. On the 27th of November 2023, we held a well attended Council strategy day to put these values into practice. The report on actions agreed with plans for delivery will be forthcoming in the near future.

One of the privileges of serving as President of BAOMS is to represent the Association. I received a warm welcome at the impressive American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons (AAOMS) conference in San Diego in September 2023 where I received a special Honorary Fellowship, attended the Past Presidents' dinner and the President's event at the USS Midway Museum. It was also an honour to host the BAOMS Past Presidents' lunch on the 17th of November at Lincoln's Inn hall. It was well attended and supported with a forward thinking address by Mike Awty.

This year's Presidential initiative is patient centred, for awards that impact patient care, information and involve patient collaboration. Successful applicants have been awarded funds to develop their ideas which they will showcase at the annual scientific meeting in Oxford.

BAOMS ANNUAL SCIENTIFIC MEETING 2024

It gives me great pleasure to invite you all to the BAOMS Annual Scientific Meeting at the Oxford Mathematical Institute, 3rd - 5th July 2024. CHAIR'S REPORT

I) We continue to have a good relationship with both the GMC and GDC and are proposing to arrange a joint meeting with them and BAOMS to see what might be possible to help training options given the existing legislation and regulatory requirements. You may be aware that we were able to secure a policy with the GDC around registration requirements for dual qualified OMFS colleagues, which recognises Oral surgery as part of OMFS and therefore is regulated by the GMC. Essentially, OMFS colleagues registered with the GMC do not have to be registered with the GDC if they undertake oral surgery procedures in either primary or secondary care, though they cannot practice any dentistry if not registered with the GDC. The policy is available here: GDC position statement on dual registration requirements (gdc-uk.org)

However, the GDC have not been able to significantly change their position around temporary registered dental colleagues working in OMFS. The new wording around this is copied below:

As for all GDC registrants, temporary registration allows registrants to practise dentistry only. Regardless of the extent of their overseas training, temporary registrants must only practise dentistry in their scope of practice and in line with the specific restrictions in their direction. We remind temporary registrants and any person involved in arrangements for approved posts that in the UK, oral and maxillofacial surgery is a medical specialty. Whilst temporary registrants may take up approved posts in OMFS departments, any activity undertaken in such posts must be appropriate to the training and scope of an oral surgeon.

- 2) Following the success of a free BAOMS funded illustrated book for medical students published in 2022, BAOMS Council approved for a similar book to be published for dental students. This is being led by Nabeela Ahmed and is now at an advanced stage and should be published and freely available in the spring 2024. We will see whether the Dental Schools Council will be able to promote this across the UK in a similar way that the Medical School Council did last year.
- 3) Our differential attainment work has found that OMFS trainees have the lowest MRCS Part A pass rates across the specialties. (Click here for paper). Council agreed to fund £350 towards MRCS course expenses for our trainees. To date Council has approved funding for over 80 trainees. We are currently updating the application criteria and have put the initiative on hold until this is finalised.
- 4) Following a competitive selection and interview process, BAOMS Council recently appointed David Keith, Consultant OMFS in Sunderland, as Deputy Chair of Council from January 2024. David will take over from me as Chair in January 2025. On the same day, Rabin Singh was appointed as the new Deputy Editor of BIOMS and AdOMS.
- 5) Finally I wish to thank Council for their hard work, support and vision over the last year and we are looking forward to a productive year ahead.

QPMS QUALITY OUTCOME MEASURES IN ORAL AND MAXILLOFACIAL SURGERY

DECEMBER 2023 UPDATE: 2023 has flown by so quickly and we cannot believe it is already December 2023.

QOMS PROGRESS

Twenty-three hospitals across England, Wales and Scotland have contributed to the registries in QOMS. Over the past year, the OMFS teams from Eastbourne, Dundee, Carlisle, Northampton, Derby and York have joined the initiative.

We have now collected over 8000 patient episodes of treatment in REDCap across our 6 core audits. This would not be possible without all the data coordinators and surgeons participating to the project. Thank you all.

Reporting outcomes remains at the forefront of the project:

- We published in February 2023 (revised in October 2023) the first QOMS report for the 2021-2022 period. Preliminary comparative data for outcomes in relation to the quality indicator metrics in the Oncology, Reconstruction and Non-Melanoma Skin Cancers registries were included in the report.
- In reporting of flap reconstruction outcomes in the Oncology & Reconstruction registry, we have specifically developed a Cumulative Sum (CuSUM) chart module for flap outcomes with Queen Mary University of London that plots longitudinally flap outcomes and associated risks in a CuSUM chart.

• There has been ongoing development in the design of dashboards for users. We have recently added a Morbidity and Mortality 2022 vs 2023, and a new Head and Neck GIRFT review dashboard is to be released by the end of 2023. Please contact us if you have any suggestions for new dashboards or to improve existing ones.

NEW CONTENT IN QOMS

Following the publication of the QOMS report, the content of the Trauma, NMSC and Oral and dentoalveolar registries were updated.

We have made progress on the development of two new registries. The Salivary Gland Cancers registry was launched in October 2023 and the Rare Benign Lesions of the Jaws registry is due to be launched in December 2023, both were recently presented in the "Remembering Rare Diseases" day at the House of Lords, hosted by the Head and Neck Cancer Foundation (Professor Mark McGurk and team).

A new set of PROM for orthognathic surgery has been agreed and is currently being piloted at two hospitals. This new BAOMS

BOS Orthognathic PROM is a collaboration with the British Orthodontic Society (BOS).

We have developed two add-on modules for the QOMS Oncology & Reconstruction registries. One will capture outcomes for patient-specific implants for mandible reconstruction and the "Restorative dentistry / Oral rehabilitation for oncology patients" module will assess the timeliness of restorative dentistry services in the treatment of patients affected by oral / head and neck cancers.

REPORTS FOR BAOMS ANNUAL SCIENTIFIC MEETING (ASM) AND OTHER MEMBER MEETINGS IN 2023

BAOMS ASM 28-30 JUNE 2023 - KINGS PLACE, YORK WAY, NORTH LONDON



This year the BAOMS ASM was held in London at Kings Place from 28-30 June 2023 with a theme of Health and Wellbeing. During the meeting, the BAOMS AGM and Awards Ceremony took place on Wednesday 28 June and the Presidential handover, on Friday 30 June at the end of the conference.

The main scientific programme included Mr Peter Duffy MBE, who presented the President's Lecture entitled: NHS Whistleblowing – a personal experience. The Norman Rower Lecture was delivered by Mr Simon Fleming entitled: Challenging Culture.

There was a variety of themed sessions over the three days which included 'Things I wish I'd known before...
I started a research career; I became a consultant oral surgeon and a session on overcoming adversity. There were also three Question Time styled sessions on skin cancer, research and orthognathic surgery and presentations on interests outside surgery: Animal husbandry, Sculpture and Wildlife Photography.

There were 72 free papers which ran in parallel to the keynotes and symposia over all three days and there also 152 ePoster abstracts. The Top 10 posters were on display on site

during the meeting. All accepted abstracts are published online in BJOMS (under the condition that the main author attends the meeting).

There was a welcome reception around the medical exhibition on Wednesday 28 June with a magician performing some very interesting magic tricks. The Annual Dinner, on Thursday 29 June was held at the Great Hall in Lincoln's Inn with the usual after dinner toasts and dancing to a live band.

There were three premium event sponsors: KLS Martin, DePuy Synthes and Stryker along with other exhibiting companies. We are grateful for their support of the BAOMS ASM. There was also a conference app which was well received.

Total overall onsite attendance in 2023 were 450 (377 members, 73 non-members) over the three-day event at Kings Place close to Kings Cross St Pancras in North London.

REPORT OF 2023 JUNIOR TRAINEES CONFERENCE HELD 11/12 NOVEMBER 2023

The JTG have had a very successful year building on the momentum developed over the previous 12 months. We have had more JTG regional and university representatives than ever before meaning there have been more OMFS themed junior trainee events than ever before, promoting OMFS as a specialty and providing a supportive network of near-peers nationally. Our annual conference ran 10 -12th November in Sheffield. This was extremely successful with a record attendance of 176 delegates.

Friday 10th November Pre-conference day

On the Friday, we ran a "pre-conference course" which was a full day programme themed around head and neck cancer. This limited course had 15 attendees and included 3 sessions each delivered by consultant faculty:

- I) Airway masterclass: front of neck access, airway assessment, flexible nasoendoscopy.
- 2) Fibula masterclass: planning of mandibular reconstruction, planning dental rehabilitation, plate bending.
- 3) Microsurgery masterclass: microsurgical anastomosis: end to end, end to side, nerve repair.

11th & 12th November - Main conference

The venue for the main conference was the Mercure St Pauls hotel in central Sheffield.

We had unprecedented interest in attending the conference and sold out all aspects. Generous industry sponsorship in addition to a grant from BAOMS contributed to this being an extremely high-quality event promoting the specialty.

On a personal note I am extremely proud of the number of non-members and first degree students / foundation doctors we attracted to the conference (10% of delegates). Over I40 delegates were allocated places on the hands on workshops over the course of the weekend including trauma plating workshops and skin cancer workshops.

I 50 delegates joined us for the annual JTG gala dinner, hosted at the Mowbray. At the dinner we held a charity raffle, with prizes generously donated by sponsors. This raised over £1000 for Macmillan cancer support. Interest in OMFS has never been greater.






