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



Dear friends and colleagues,

My wife Diane and I and all of my colleagues in Sunderland are looking forward to welcoming you to Durham for our annual scientific meeting in June. We have tried to structure the programme to meet the educational needs of as many as possible, by concentrating the plenary sessions, masterclasses and keynotes in areas of every day practice for the majority. I am very honoured that Derek Alderson, President of RCS England has agreed to deliver the president's lecture and Professor Klaus-Dietrich Wolff, President of EACMFS has kindly agreed to deliver the Norman Rowe lecture.

My colleagues have put together an impressive collection of pre-meeting practical and innovative courses on the Monday and Tuesday, which have been generously supported by our commercial sponsors and cover: dermal fillers, complex implants, cadaveric hands on course covering facial re-animation and approaches to the infra-temporal fossa, sialendoscopy and microvascular coupling. There are early morning masterclasses on robotic surgery, perforator flaps, nasal reconstruction, use of the dermatoscope, sports injuries, and cone beam CT. Places for these courses and masterclasses are limited and heavily subsidised, so please book early to avoid disappointment.

There will be plenary sessions covering oncology, reconstruction, skin surgery, facial deformity, and aesthetic surgery. There will also be special keynote lectures updating on oral medicine and mucosal dysplasia, an update on the new OMFS curriculum and a special session for SAS surgeons organised by our associate fellows; so hopefully something for everybody.

There is ample opportunity to listen and engage in debate during the free papers, and there will be a wide selection of electronic posters to peruse.

Please note because of space constraints, delegate numbers will be limited and available on a "first come first served" basis, and as I have already mentioned due to the England v Australia cricket international, you are strongly recommended to book hotels early. Because of the limited space we will only be offering packed lunches this year (reflected in the conference fee), however, there are numerous restaurants in the Piazza surrounding the Gala Theatre for those wanting a more substantial meal.

The welcome reception will be held in Durham cathedral, a world heritage site within walking distance of the Gala Theatre and the conference hotel. The Annual Black Tie Gala Dinner and Dance with live band will be held in the Radisson Blu hotel. In addition Diane has organised a cultural day out in the North East for accompanying persons on Thursday, and there are a number of networking events available to facilitate exchange of ideas and reflection with colleagues in a less formal setting.

Finally I hope you will make some time to take in the beautiful city of Durham and perhaps venture further afield to Hadrian's Wall, and the spectacular County Durham and Northumbrian countryside and coastline.







