





Dr David Andrew (Consultant Maxillofacial Radiologist), Dr Stefan Jankowski (Consultant Anesthetist) and the specialist head and neck sonography team will deliver the theory and principles of ultrasonography, practical applications (cannulation, assessing vessel flow, pedicle flow), neck sweeps and assessment of lumps (including FNA/Core biopsies). This will be a theory and practical course using simulated models providing a hands-on experience.


