BAOMS Student Bursary Project Abstract

For presentation and consideration at the BAOMS Endowments Sub-committee meeting

Introduction

I proposed the development and introduction of a new accessible website designed for Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery SHO's. There are a number of limited resources available to trainees with a number apps recently being developed. There currently does not exist a stand alone, easily accessible and free resource that caters to developing OMFS trainees as they begin posts at foundation or core surgical training level.

This project created a website with the umbrella title www.themaxfaxsho.com with typical presentations that were seen in the emergency department, clinic, theatres, ward and general emergencies. There is also a basic knowledge section that introduces general concepts such as anatomy and dental charting, dental occlusion and oral cavity anatomy. The website will be free and accessible to all trainees and provide readily available and accessible information relevant to working in an SHO post and being oncall in OMFS. The full contents and live URL will be activated once BAOMS permission and approval is given.

This website is developed by trainees, for trainees. It can remain as a standalone resource for knowledge however there is excellent room for further expansion with training videos, conference information advertisement and trainee forums for discussion and advice.
